

Santa Cruz County Tourism Marketing District Renewal

Mission Statement

The Mission of Visit Santa Cruz County is to stimulate the economy by promoting Santa Cruz County as a visitor, conference and film destination through marketing programs including advertising, promotion, and visitor services. The priority is on attracting highyield overnight business during the off-peak periods of the year.

Talking Points

- 1. Why the renewal of the TMD is so important to the recovery efforts and long-term health of Santa Cruz County's tourism industry.
 - a. The TMD is the primary funding source to promote overnight tourism to Santa Cruz County. Competing destinations also have TMD's that raise upwards of \$2 million or more to aggressively promote their destinations. Without a competitive tourism marketing budget Santa Cruz County will lose business to competing destinations.
- 2. How are decisions made regarding marketing and spending out the TMD funds?
 - a. The VSCC Board of Directors is mandated to have a majority membership made up of lodging representatives. The VSCC Board approves the marketing plan and annual budget.
- 3. Is the Mission of VSCC consistent with the needs of the TMD?
 - a. The mission of VSCC continues to be promoting overnight tourism.

 - o Tier 1: \$1.90

- What does the current TMD generate for tourism marketing and how does that compare to competing California vacation destinations?
 - In 2018/2019 (before COVID) the TMD generated \$2.6 million
 - Similar coastal destinations such as Monterey, San Luis Obispo and Ventura all have at least \$2 million TMD budgets

- Is the current TMD countywide and is the plan to maintain a countywide structure?
 Yes
- Who is involved with the renewal of the district?
 - Twenty lodging representatives are on the renewal task force to develop recommendations
 - The entire TMD membership and the VSCC Board of Directors are included in discussions and outreach
 - \circ $\;$ TMD lodging members will ultimately vote on the renewal of the district
 - Based on the lodging member vote, final approval will be sought from the Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors and each City Council (Capitola, Santa Cruz, Scotts Valley and Watsonville)
